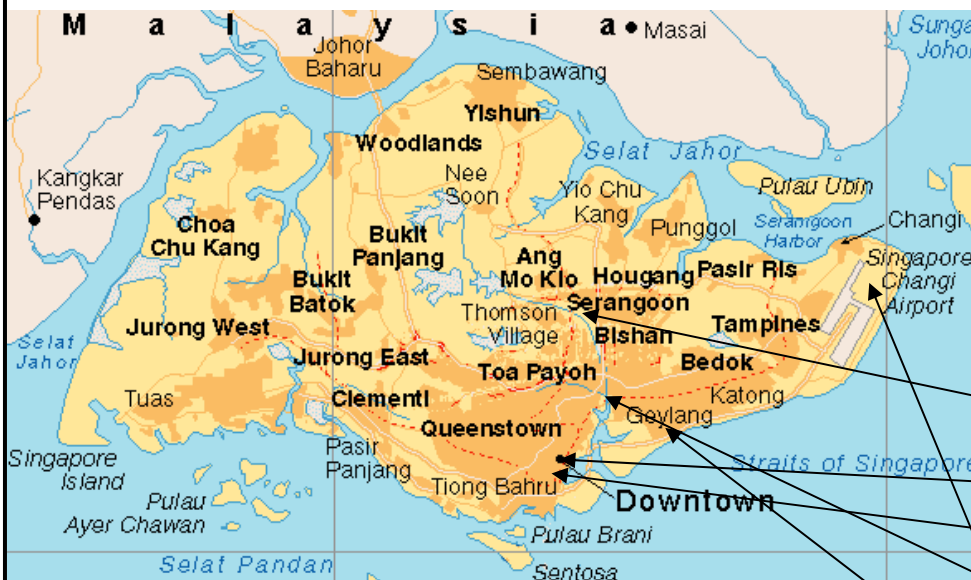
## About Singapore

By Asian standards hotels in Singapore tend to be a little expensive.

Expect to pay a minimum of SGD \$150 per night for a reasonable hotel room.

Some rooms may include breakfast, but this is not a necessary option as food on the street is plentiful, good & cheap.

Because the island is small, and taxis are reasonably priced, as long as you stay in the South-East you will be handy to the City and no more than 15-30 minutes from the Australian International School.
